Title: **ASYLUM INFORMATION DATABASE (AIDA)**

Type of resource: Database

Short Description

The Asylum Information Database (AIDA) is a database managed by the European Council on Refugees and Exiles (ECRE), containing information on asylum procedures, reception conditions, detention and content of international protection across 23 countries. This includes 20 European Union (EU) Member States (Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Germany, Spain, France, Greece, Croatia, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Sweden, Slovenia, United Kingdom) and 3 non-EU countries (Switzerland, Serbia, Turkey). The overall goal of the database is to contribute to the improvement of asylum policies and practices in Europe and the situation of asylum seekers by providing all relevant actors with appropriate tools and information to support their advocacy and litigation efforts, both at the national and European level. These objectives are carried out by AIDA through the following activities: Country reports, Comparative reports, Fact-finding visits, Legal briefings, statistical updates.

Title: **INDEX OF LEGISLATION RELATING TO UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN**

Type of resource: Index

Short Description

The index of legislation relating to unaccompanied children is one of the ASOP4G projects' tools. It is intended to assist the guardian to better carry out his/her mandates. International, EU and national legislation regulate issues relating specifically to unaccompanied children in a very fragmentary way, making it very difficult for guardians to protect the rights and interests of the children in their care. Therefore the aim of the Index is to provide a systematic list of International, EU and national legislation relating to unaccompanied children in order to help guardians perform their functions properly. In the Index, the legislation is systematized according to the most important areas of their lives that unaccompanied children are most likely to encounter in practice.

The project “Alliance for Children on the Move: Standard Operating Procedures for Guardians”-ASOP4G (REC-CHILD-AG-2016-02/764244- ASOP4G) has been co-funded by the European Union’s Rights, Equality and Citizenship Programme (2014-2020). The present Index has been jointly developed by the ASOP4G project team, consisting of members of the Institute of Child Health-Department of Mental Health and Social Welfare (GR), Defence for Children International-Italy (IT), University of Nicosia-School of Humanities and Social Sciences/Department of Social Sciences/Social Work Program (CY) and Kazimieras Simonavicius University-Faculty of Law (LT).
